Sensitive and confidential services and resources at Cornell Health

Cornell Health's medical and mental health providers strive to deliver care that is respectful and responsive to students' diverse needs, experiences, gender identities, sexual orientations, and values.

Sexual health services

- Preventive sexual health exams and screenings including wellness exams, sexually transmitted infection (STI) screenings, and Pap smears / cervical cancer screenings
- Contraception options including prescription birth control, and emergency contraception (available 24/7 through our vending machine)
- Sexually transmitted infection (STI) prevention (including PrEP/PEP), plus testing and treatment
- Safer sex supplies in our pharmacy and 24/7 vending machine including condoms, lube, etc.
- **Pregnancy testing and consultation,** plus pregnancy options referrals
- **Counseling and support** for concerns related to relationships, identity, intimacy, sexual functioning, and sexual trauma

Other related services

- Gender-affirming care including hormone therapy and binding / tucking supplies
- Assistance to victims of assault through our SHARE office (share.cornell.edu)
